This epic and dramatic story weaves together themes of conservation, ecology, development, finance, politics and sustainable agriculture.



Slated for massive development, eight-lane highways, dense development both on land and in the marinas and lagoons, the coasts would have come to look like the San Francisco Peninsula, packed from stem to stern. The rural beauty and traditional farmlands would have been driven out. Developers had begun work on the proposed plans when a coalition emerged, formed of local people, conservationists, ranchers, farmers, ordinary citizens, and government officials who saw what could happen on the coast. Banding together, this group with vastly different backgrounds and interests came together and fought tirelessly to prevent the scheduled development, and in the process, created a model for sustainable agriculture in close proximity to urban development.

Moments in Time is about the crucial moments that any campaign for change must reach to accomplish its goals. It illustrates how people with vastly different ideas can create something coherent and illuminates how an accumulation of individual visions can become a profound, connected success. Moments in Time has the potential to inspire audiences around the world to take action, form alliances, and persist to make the world a better place.
