Conversion to Digital-only TV delayed

Remember that Feb. 17 deadline for American television stations to convert to digital-only operations? It's no longer operational.

Thanks to Congressional passage of the DTV Delay Act, the deadline date for the national digital television transition has been delayed to June 12. Consequently, KRCB will continue broadcasting analog and digital over the air signals beyond February 17th.

The DTV Delay Act also extends the coupon program for digital conversion boxes until July 31, and requires the federal government to issue, upon request, a replacement coupon for any coupon that may have expired without being redeemed.

Individual stations are still allowed to terminate their analog broadcasts before the deadline, subject to certain FCC rules, but KRCB does not expect to be among them.

The DTV Delay Act passed by Congress does not include funds for additional coupons. An additional \$650 million is proposed for the Coupon Program the H.R. 1, the stimulus legislation, which must pass in order for NTIA to distribute additional coupons beyond what it can distribute with funds from expiring coupons. This legislation is also required for some of the provisions outlined in the DTV Delay Act to be enacted, including the ability of the Assistant Secretary to allow consumers whose coupons have expired to reapply for replacement coupons. At this time, a consumer who tries to reapply for a coupon that has expired, or was lost or stolen, will be denied.

Consumers who have not applied for a TV Converter Box Coupon may still do so, but they will be placed on a waiting list. Requests from eligible households continue to be filled as funds become available from expired and unredeemed coupons. NTIA's number one priority is to eliminate the waiting list but it cannot do so until legislation providing additional funding is passed. If and when Congress authorizes additional funding, NTIA will alert our partner groups and provide you with information to share with your constituencies.

She has arranged and facilitated neighborhood meetings in both English and Spanish and guided under-represented community members in their efforts to be heard and responded to by public officials.

In 1986 she received the California Human Development's Individual Achievement Award for her leadership role in establishing a bilingual program in the local school district. Spurred by local citizens, Cheryl ran and was elected to here local school board and subsequently served for 16 years. In 2008 she was elected to the Windsor Town Council.

Cheryl received a BA in Psychology from Sonoma State University in 1975 and her Psychology MA in from Petaluma's Institute of Imaginal Studies in 1997. As a student in the Master's Program in Organization Development at Sonoma State, she helped plan and implement a community-wide Future Search Conference in 2003 that brought together over 60 stakeholders to address the future of Windsor's youth.

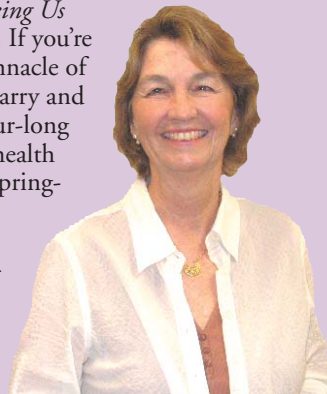

March 1 – Old Friends

Host Bill McLaughlin reunites with some long-time friends of *Saint Paul Sunday*: the Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Trio. Joseph Kalichstein, Jaime Laredo, and Sharon Robinson will perform two masterworks of Brahms, a touchingly beautiful movement from Beethoven, and Andy Stein's arrangement of Gershwin's *Summertime*.



March 8 – Less is More

The spare sound of the string trio drew from Mozart a lovely contradiction: a work of great elegance and richness. This week, we'll hear his *E-flat Divertimento* performed by the masterful Zehetmair String Trio, who'll also play an often-overlooked fragment of Schubert, and an exuberant work composed in 1944 by 23-year-old Czech composer Gideon Klein. As if to tie these three great works together, Mr. Zehetmair then steps out by himself, concluding the hour with Eugène Ysaÿe's *Ballade*, a pinnacle of the solo violin repertoire.



March 15 – Time Travel

Perhaps the surest sign of artistry among those musicians who specialize in early music is how convincingly they bid us into the world that first gave life to their chosen repertoire. This week, the celebrated King's Noyse—including soprano Ellen Hargis and lutenist Paul O'Dette—draws us into the time of Purcell, Praetorius and others, not only by remaining true to those composers' origins but reviving them with the ensembles own particular magic.

March 22 – Cries from the Heart

The madrigals of Don Carlo Gesualdo comprise some of the most intensely expressive

music ever composed. This week the celebrated Brentano String Quartet brings five of them to us as they've been re-imagined by composer Bruce Adolphe. The Brentano captures all of the sweet torment of the pieces, whose vividly compounded moods set the stage well for what comes next: Mozart's *A Major Quartet* (K. 464). Our guest host is Ara Guzelimian, Senior Director and Artistic Advisor at Carnegie Hall.



March 29 – Aerie

Czech Nonet will give us tastes of Förster and Krejčí side-by-side with fuller courses of Dvořák and Martino. The latter holds special significance for the ensemble, with expansiveness typical of Martino's music. Each day as a sickly young child, the composer's father, a watchman, carried him up 193 steps to the top of their village tower. Years later Martino

Get a handle on Opera Sunday!

Tune in to *Sunday Classics* on **March 1 at noon** for our March Opera, Handel's *Ariodante*. Originally performed on January 8, 1735, *Ariodante* opened Handel's first season at Covent Garden. After languishing unperformed for over 200 years, revivals started in the 1970s and it has since become recognized as one of his finest works.

The anonymous Italian libretto draws from Ludovico Ariosto's romantic epic poem, *Orlando Furioso*, also the source of two other Handel operas (*Alcina* and *Orlando*) and numerous other Baroque operas (including Vivaldi's *Orlando Furioso* which we broadcast last year).

In the plot, She (Ginevra) and He (Ariodante) are betrothed, jealous other man (Polinesso) tricks him into believing She and JOM are loves. Dad disowns Her: He is reported a suicide. JOM defends Her honor in a tournament, is mortally wounded and confesses his guilt. Dad pardons Her and They live happily ever after. Nicholas McGegan conducts an all star cast

A Novel Idea spans three generations

Eva Rutland is a born teller of stories, good stories. She has written more than 20 novels, and is the winner of the 2000 Golden Pen Award for Lifetime Achievement. Her memoir, *When We Were Colored, A Mother's Story*, was first published in 1964 and has recently been reissued. It's a compelling time trip through the years immediately after the Second World War, the years when Rutland and her husband raised their four lively children, the years of the transition from segregation to civil rights. Former San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown describes her book as "warm, poignant and funny."

Adam David Miller and Nickole Brown on *WordTemple*

At age nineteen, Adam David Miller passed a white girl a note that read, "I would like to get to know you better." For this innocent action he was arrested and jailed for attempted rape in pre-civil rights Orangeburg, South Carolina. On this month's *WordTemple*, Katherine Hastings presents an in-depth interview with Miller—a poet and writer—who reads from his Saroyan Prize nominated memoir, *Ticket to Exile*.

Following the interview with Miller, Kentucky poet Nickole Brown reads from her novel in verse, *Sister*. 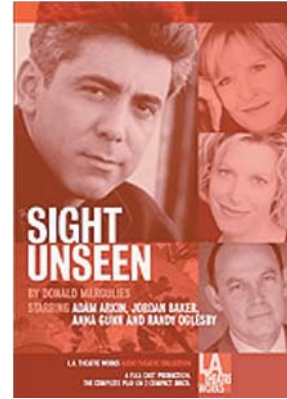
Saturday evening is *Play* time

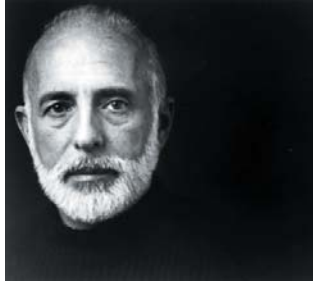
